This week has seen the start of Black History Month, which is celebrated every year throughout the month of October. The aim of Black History Month is to celebrate the history, art and culture of Black British people and to learn about the lives of Black British people, who may not be seen as much in the books, films and television that we see around us. It is important for all of our identities to see people who look like ourselves in the books we read and the programmes we watch, to help everyone understand that we are all valued members of society. Celebrating Black History Month at our school reminds us of the importance of having **RESPECT** for each other and tolerance for all cultures, and that we can all learn from one another.

At James Wolfe, we are **PROUD** of our wonderfully multicultural community and strive to ensure that our curriculum reflects the diversity of our children and their families. Throughout this month, we be exploring the lives of some incredible black role models and finding out how many of them have **PERSEVERED** to achieve their goals. We will be reading stories written by black authors or that include a diverse range of illustrations that reflect the world around us, listening to music from Africa and the Caribbean and finding out how music from black history has influenced the music that we listen to today, and much more to celebrate and further our understanding of what it means to be a Black British person living in the UK today.

I wonder if the books in your house reflect the community of friends that your family share your lives with? Can your children find themselves represented in the films that you watch together? What message does your child receive about their identity and the identities of those around them? These can sometimes be tricky questions to ask ourselves, but they are some the most important questions that we, as adults, can ask - and the answers can lead us to some interesting revelations that just may change our children's future. By surrounding our children with positive role models who persevere through challenges and have compassion for others, we encourage them to believe in themselves and have faith in those around them -- and a child who believes in themselves can achieve anything!
