

Dear Parents,



We are now fully into the swing of the first half of the Summer term. Being the busy term that it is, I would like to draw your attention to some key dates for upcoming events we think you would love to join us for.

Firstly, next Friday, we will be holding a whole-school Coronation Day celebration in Greenwich Park to mark the coronation of King Charles III to the throne. Please see further details below about the organisation and how we will share this historic day together. This is an event for the children and staff, however, and we will not be able to accommodate parents at the event too -- but we will share photos on our Instagram account after the event.

During the month of June, will be celebrating the sensational work your child has achieved this year by holding a celebratory assembly for each class. You will be invited to hear and see the learning your child has been engaged in and things they have enjoyed throughout the year. Please arrive five minutes early to all performances, as they will begin promptly. Separately, Year 6 will be having their own Leavers' Assembly to celebrate their time at James Wolfe, which will be held on Thursday 17th July and parents will be welcome to join this; further details will follow. Please see the list of assembly and sports day dates below.

Speaking of Sports Days, this year, for Years 1-6, they will be held in Greenwich Park. We will be based on the Ranger's Field at the top of the park and welcome parents to join us for the entirety of the event (especially for the adults' race at the end of the morning!). Please be aware that children will be able to wear their PE kit to school on this day and we ask that you provide a drink, plus sun cream and a hat if appropriate.

Lastly, we will be holding our usual Open Evening on Wednesday 5th July. The evening is an opportunity for you to speak to your child's class teacher about their progress and achievements throughout the year. It will also provide a chance for you to meet your child's new teacher and take a tour of what will be their new classroom.

Please do ask if you have any questions related to these dates and events. Further details for each event will follow over the next half of term.

Have a lovely extended weekend and remember, we will be ready to welcome the children back to school on Tuesday 2nd May (although it is highly likely there will be industrial action on this day, so there may only be a minority of classes open -- we will endeavour to have information to you as soon as possible regarding this), as Monday is a Bank Holiday.


AFTER-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

SLEEP RESEARCH

Sleep is one of the most important elements of child development, yet research is significantly lacking in this area. Amy Tyler, a researcher from the Tavistock and Portman NHS Foundation Trust is hoping, with your support, to delve into this important area and support families and those working with children nationwide to provide the help needed when children are struggling with their sleep. It is hoped that this study will help increase understanding of the demand/need for sleep related support for parents of children aged 3-11, what sleep-related support parents would like and what barriers or facilitators there may be for parents to access support.

PROMPT ARRIVAL

A punctual, settled start to the morning makes a significant difference to the quality of children's learning and the safety of all those around. Please ensure pupils arrive on time for class.

KEEPING OUR CHILDREN SAFE

We remind all parents that the zig-zag lines outside our school buildings must not be parked on by parents for drop off or collection of children. We have had incidents outside both campuses and we ask all parents to help keep our children safe as they walk to and from our school. To this end, the Greenwich Road Safety Team have organised for police officers to patrol outside each campus.



CARS IDLING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

We remind parents not to idle their vehicles outside the school, particularly in the evenings, when waiting for children to come out from after-school clubs or One World. The fumes contain a number of harmful gasses including carbon dioxide, which is bad for the environment and contributes towards climate change, as well as nitrogen dioxide, carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons, which are linked to asthma and other lung diseases.

Local authorities have the power to issue £20 fixed penalties for emission offences and stationary idling under The Road Traffic (Vehicle Emissions) (Fixed Penalty) (England) Regulations 2002.
