

With over 400 sessions a week, activities are free and take place in four main youth hubs, through their partners, open spaces, parks and recognised programmes, such as the Duke of Edinburgh's award. There are specialist youth clubs, after-school and holiday sessions designed to get involved with -- all with specially trained workers. You can become a member of Young Greenwich for free and get access to a variety of great activities, take opportunities, meet friends, learn new skills and go on fantastic trips!

They can also refer to health and wellbeing services in the local area and provide help and support for parents.

RANDALL PLACE PLAYGROUND GATE UPDATE

Given the number of clubs and activities that run after-school at Randall Place, we have made the decision that all parents are required to vacate the playground as soon as they have collected their child(ren). The gate will then be padlocked, so we can continue to safeguard those children at after-school clubs and activities. Many thanks for your support with this.



MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Please can we ask parents to ensure they **do not put any medicines, tablets or creams into their child's bag**. Any medicine your child requires should be administered by school staff and can only be accepted by the school office if:

 The medication has a prescription label stuck to it detailing the child's name.
The Parental Agreement for School/Setting to Administer Medicine form has been fully filled in, signed by the parent and handed in with the medication.

3) The medication is **in date**. Please note that parents are responsible for making a note of the expiry date and replacing medicine when required.

Two Epipens are needed in school for children requiring them. For Antibiotics, the prescription label must say it needs to be given **four** times a day.



BIKES & SCOOTERS

It's wonderful to see so many children scooting and cycling to school - however, for safety reasons, we ask that children do not ride them in the playground before or after school.



SICKNESS

We remind all parents that, if your child is absent unwell, this must be reported to the school every day that they do not attend. Children should not return to school until <u>48 hours after their last incidence of vomiting or diarrhoea</u>. We thank all parents for their ongoing support with this.



OUT OF HOURS

A number of organisations use our space to deliver their programmes out of school hours, including Young Education Services and the Anna Fiorentini Theatre School, a German school, Bananadrama, a soul choir, Spanish classes, the Angelina Jandolo Ballet School, Link Chinese school, Bounce exercise classes, ISK Karate Club, Sabia Duvida Portuguese School and the Greenwich Historical Society. BREAKFAST CLUB BOOKING

Breakfast Club is available for booking via our online booking system, with bookings by the day or term available. Places are allocated on a first come, first served basis and are limited. To book. please go to the School Activity website at <u>https://jameswolfe.schoolactivity.co.uk</u>. If you would like to cancel a booking, please request this from the school office, who will generate an automatic refund for any session that has not yet taken place. Please note, however, that only whole bookings can be cancelled, not individual days from a booking -- we would have to cancel the whole booking and you would then have to re-book the days you require.

Please can we remind parents that pupils must arrive by 8:30am.

The charge for the week remains at £12.50 (£2.50 per day), which must be paid when making the booking. Parents with Pupil Premium children or those who wish to pay with childcare vouchers must contact the school office before setting up an account, or they will be charged as normal.
